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As of Monday, June 28, all adults 18+ are now eligible to book their second dose at an accelerated interval.

Community Vaccination Clinics (Mass Immunization Clinics)

Open to **all** Ottawa residents 12 and older. Youth must be 12 or older on the day of their appointment.

Vaccinations are currently available at the following community clinics

COVID-19 Vaccine Wait List

Residents can now use an online tool to book last-minute, same-day COVID-19 vaccinations at community clinics in Ottawa. The tool allows eligible residents to sign up daily for a [COVID-19 vaccine wait list](#) to receive a first or second dose appointment. As appointments open up, Ottawa Public Health contacts the resident by text, email or phone.

High-priority Neighbourhoods

All pop-up vaccine clinics are accepting residents from any of Ottawa's [priority neighbourhoods](#). First and second doses (for those currently eligible) are available for any priority neighbourhood residents. This includes teachers, staff, students and their households of any school located in a priority neighbourhood. To check your home or school address for eligibility visit OttawaPublicHealth.ca.

Expanding eligibility will raise vaccination rates in priority neighbourhoods and assist in removing some of the greatest barriers to accessing the vaccine. Residents from outside priority neighbourhoods will be directed to available appointments in the [provincial booking system](#) or at a participating [pharmacy](#).

Mobile Vaccination Teams

- Mobile vaccination teams are providing vaccinations to congregate care settings, including shelters and homebound residents.





- **Homebound residents:** The EOC continues collaboration with partners to identify additional homebound residents to immunize them and an essential caregiver, in-home. Homebound clients can request in-home vaccination by themselves, by their caregiver, or by referral from their primary care provider by calling the OPH Vaccine Booking Line at 613-691-5505 - Option #2. **We are defining a homebound resident as:** an individual who has medical, physical, cognitive, or psychosocial needs/conditions that inhibit them from visiting a local clinic, pharmacy, or their primary care provider to receive their COVID-19 vaccination.

Indigenous Clinics

- Wabano Centre for Aboriginal Health and OPH are providing first and second doses to First Nation, Inuit and Métis community members 12 and older.

Bruyère Vaccination Clinic

The Bruyère vaccine clinic, in collaboration with OPH, has first and second dose appointments available for eligible residents of priority neighbourhoods and other priority groups that are 12 and older. Residents can visit [Bruyere.org](https://bruyere.org) to verify eligibility and book their appointment.

Youth 12-17 Years Old

Youth aged 12 and older are eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine. Youth must be 12 years old or older on the day of their appointment to book online. If they are currently 11 years old but are turning 12 years old while community clinics are running, please call the Provincial booking line at 1-833-943-3900 for an appointment.

The Province has advised that to support a safe return to school in September, they will be looking to accelerate youth second dose bookings following individuals aged 18 and over.

Second Doses

Vaccine Interchangeability

On June 1, 2021, the [National Advisory Committee on Immunization \(NACI\)](#) updated their recommendations on the interchangeability of COVID-19 vaccines used in Canada. This means that you could receive one vaccine for your first dose and a different vaccine for your second dose to complete your series.

While we are currently offering both Moderna and Pfizer at our community clinics, given fluctuations in our vaccine supply, we cannot guarantee a particular vaccine type for





adults 18 years and older. Interchanging mRNA vaccines is safe, effective, and not a new practice. The priority is to receive two doses of a vaccine to complete the series and be fully protected. Getting the same vaccine for first and second doses or getting one vaccine for a first dose and different vaccine for a second dose (also called a “mixed schedule”), are both considered valid options. Both schedules will count as a full series.

Anyone with allergies to a vaccine, or a specific component of a vaccine must consult a physician to determine if vaccination is still possible, and if so, which vaccine is appropriate.

Accelerated Second Dose Eligibility

- **As of Monday, June 28:** all individuals 18 and older are now eligible to book or rebook their accelerated second dose appointment. The appointment will be scheduled at least 28 days after the first dose, per the recommended interval.
- **AstraZeneca:** Individuals who received AstraZeneca as their first dose can choose to either receive a second dose of AstraZeneca or an mRNA vaccine 8-12 weeks after their first dose.
 - Individuals who would like their second dose of the AstraZeneca vaccine can contact the pharmacy or primary care provider where they received their first dose.
 - Individuals opting to receive an mRNA vaccine have the option to schedule their second dose appointment at a [participating pharmacy](#), primary care provider or a community clinic by registering for a “second dose only appointment” through the [provincial booking system](#).

General Information

Appointments in our community clinics become available when new supply is confirmed. This ensures that there is a vaccine available for every resident who arrives for their confirmed appointment.

More than 200 pharmacies across Ottawa are also receiving vaccines directly from the Province. Participating locations are available on [Ontario.ca](#). Most pharmacies book appointments ahead of time and some allow walk-ins. Eligible residents should check with the pharmacy directly. Select primary care teams are also offering vaccines.

Registering a vaccine received outside of Canada or Ontario

If you have received one or more doses of a COVID-19 vaccine outside of the Province of Ontario, you must provide your proof of immunization to OPH. [Complete the COVID-19 Out of Province Dose Documentation form](#) to notify OPH of your out of province dose administration and upload the documentation you have received.
